SIXTY YEARS OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Dolphin Scholarship Foundation was established in 1960 and granted the first award of \$350 in 1961 to John L. Haines, Jr.

As the cost of education continues to skyrocket, so does the need for the Foundation to assist students. Dolphin Scholarship Foundation grants are available, on a competitive basis, to high school or college children/stepchildren and spouses of members or former members of the Submarine Force or Navy members who have served in submarine support activities. Today, Dolphin Scholarship Foundation sponsors 124 ongoing scholarships with an annual grants ranging from \$1,500 to \$3,500 per student for two to four years of full-time undergraduate studies as well as students pursuing trade/vocational certification. DSF also awards scholarships to eligible spouses working toward their first undergraduate degree or trade/vocational certification. Approximately 25-30 new scholarships are awarded each year. Scholars are selected on the basis of academic proficiency, commitment and excellence in school and community activities as well as financial need. Since our founding over 60 years ago, Dolphin Scholarship Foundation has granted over \$14,000,000 to more than 1,500 outstanding students attending fully accredited universities and colleges throughout the U.S.

The foundation is funded through fundraising efforts, donations from submarine spouse events, private, corporate, and memorial donations.

DSF administers the following scholarships:
Laura W. Bush Scholarship, USS Colorado (SSN 788), USS Delaware (SSN 791), USS Hampton (SSN 767), USS Indiana (SSN 789), USS Nautilus (SSN 571), USS Oregon (SSN 793), and USS Washington (SSN 787).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Scholars

- Child/Step-child or Spouse of member or former member of the U.S. Navy Submarine Force
- Scholars must either attend and be enrolled full-time (or part-time for spouses) at an accredited 2 or 4-year college/university and working toward an Associate or Bachelor degree, **OR** be working toward trade/vocational certification.

Sponsors

Sponsor must meet **one (1)** of the following requirements:

- Sponsor must be qualified in submarines and served on active duty in the Submarine Force for a minimum of 8 years.

OR

- Sponsor must have served on active duty in submarine support activities for a minimum of 10 years.

Additional Criteria

-Years of service need not be consecutive; however, qualifying years **must** have been served on **ACTIVE DUTY**. Time served as a Naval Academy or NROTC midshipman, in "Boot Camp", or as a member of the inactive or Selected Naval Reserve **cannot** be used to establish eligibility.

- Student is eligible if his or her Sponsor died on active duty while serving in the Submarine Force.

- Time in service requirement may be waived by DSF if Sponsor qualified in submarines and was medically discharged or retired due to injury or illness which occurred in the line of duty.
